

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

#### **WEBINARS**

The Daily Living webinar series continued thanks to financing from UCB and AbbVie. Eleven themes pertaining to Parkinson's disease generated interest; six of which were also presented in English. When combining live and deferred broadcasting, our 2017 webinars were viewed more than 4,000 times.

#### PARKINSON'S TOUR

As part of an effort to have direct contact with the Parkinson's community, the Parkinson's Tour is an opportunity for Parkinson Québec's team members to meet people living with Parkinson's disease. During this first year, the Tour was held in six movement disorder clinics in cooperation with organizations from the regions visited. These visits helped equip and inform 123 individuals living with the disease as well as caregivers about the provincial and regional resources available to them.

#### LIVING HOPE CONGRES

This three-day event held in the Sherbrooke area, on the theme of Living Hope, was an opportunity for more than 250 people to update their knowledge on Parkinson's disease and to consider empowerment from a new angle with Anne McIsaac's presentation on the power of perspective.

#### MIEUX VIVRE AVEC LE PARKINSON

More than 100 professionals have taken the Mieux vivre avec le Parkinson training since it was created. A true learning resource, this tool is indispensable for health professionals and people working with those affected by Parkinson's disease.

#### INFOPARKINSON GUIDE

Several regional Parkinson's offices and organizations completed the training provided in the InfoParkinson Guide developed in 2016. This allows them to acquire standardized information based on the most recent knowledge and sound resources on Parkinson's disease and convey them to their members. As a result, thirty people are now able to answer inquiries and referral calls in the various regions of Quebec.

#### VIRTUAL CLASSES

Funded by L'appui national, virtual classes, in the form of specialized conferences are intended to specifically empower caregivers to act to better intervene, react and support their loved one living with Parkinson's disease. The project is in development and is slated to be rolled out in April 2018.

#### HUDDOL

Funded by the Caregiver Network and adapted to the era of virtual communication, Huddol is a social media platform for supporting caregivers with their needs. Run by a community manager, the Huddol community, pertaining to Parkinson's disease 250 members, promotes mutual assistance, information exchange and networking. Your suggestions are spot on and help me cope and better visualize the future. 

Its positions and recommendations focus on key issues such as home care, housing, support for caregivers, medically assisted death, access to care and basic services and financing for the organizations of the Regroupement.

# RESEARCH

#### INVESTMENTS

In 2017, thanks to donations from our regional Parkinson's offices and organizations, we have been able to add the clinical research component to the Quebec Research Fund on Parkinson's (FQRP).

We pursue our efforts to fund research with the hope that one day Parkinson's disease will be nothing more than a memory and the belief that it is possible to improve the quality of life for those affected by the disease.



#### RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> Research Symposium, Dr. Ron Postuma presented the results of his research, co-funded by the FQRP, on the impact of caffeine on Parkinson's disease.

## IN QUEBEG looking toward the future

Motivated by the experience acquired in recent years of cooperation and the desire to work together to support the Parkinson's community, Parkinson Québec has fulfilled the mandate conferred by the regional Parkinson's organizations by developing and proposing a new partnership arrangement. This arrangement is aimed at building on its achievements and continuing to develop services by relying on the network's active forces and on the individual needs of each of the partners.Together, we are working to identify the best way to unite our strengths for the Parkinson's community.

A new regional office was added to the network: Coeur des Laurentides. Working on the territory of Rivière-du-Nord and Pays-d'en-Haut, the Coeur des Laurentides regional office was established thanks to a three-year grant from the program Québec amis des aînés. The impact of the services in this newly served region is already being felt through the involvement of the community and people affected by Parkinson's disease.


